### About this piece

George Walton

A rare Arts & Crafts Glasgow School oak 'Abingdon' armchair.

This design is quite radical, with large flat arms which protrude out, incorporating the back legs and upright supports quite far back, giving the chair a light and airy feel. The gentle tapering legs with 1/2 splayed feet give this unique design a wonderful balanced, almost feminine feel. Yet, the continuation below the seat of the back supports gives it a subtle architectural feel and again an infusion of his own style, no doubt strongly influenced by C. R. Mackintosh.
