About this piece

M. H. Baillie Scott, attributed. Three Arts and Crafts high-back oak armchair with a tall back rising to a pierced top rail, constructed in quarter-sawn oak. Two examples have leather-inset backs, while one example has a fabric-inset back.

Although there is no firm evidence that these were designed by **M. H. Baillie Scott**, the planked full-length backs, stylised fretwork tree designs to the top, triangular seats, and low floor stretchers all strongly point to his hand.

Identical versions are illustrated in *Siegfried Wichmann, Jugendstil: Floral and Functional Forms*, Bayerisches Nationalmuseum, Munich 1984, p.121, pl.244. A similar example is illustrated on the *Blackwell* guidebook cover (*Baillie Scott, Blackwell, Windermere*).
